Webelos Res. Camp	July 14-19	\$170, includes \$25 deposit

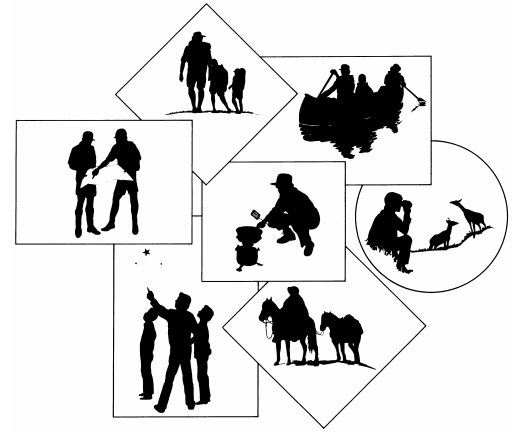

Camporee Staff Needed

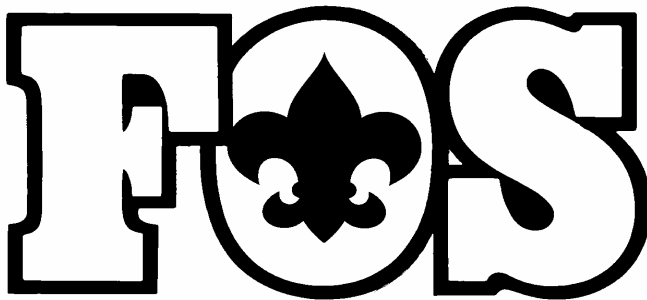
